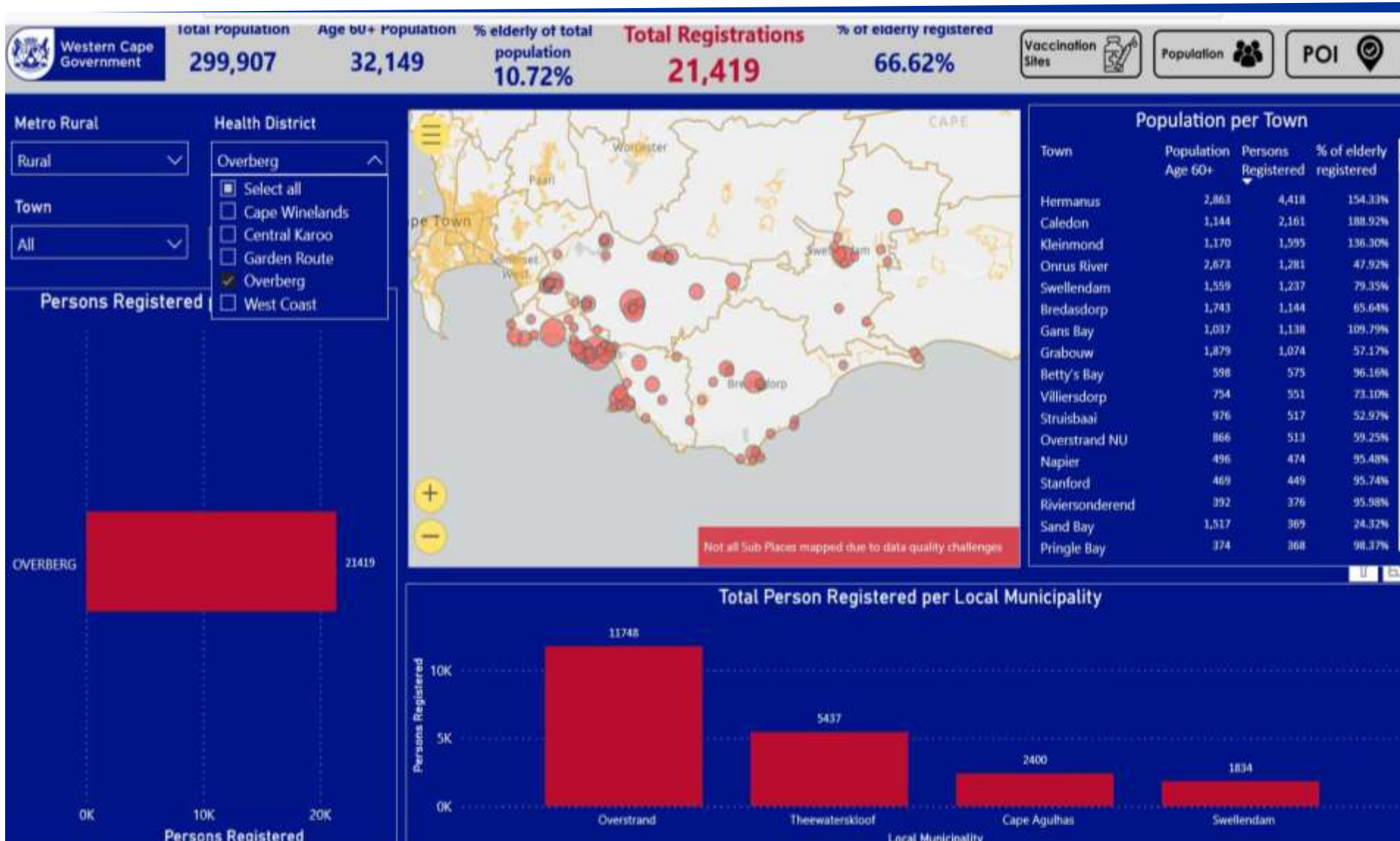
- ❖ Vaccine Cascade contains the information for all the age groups.

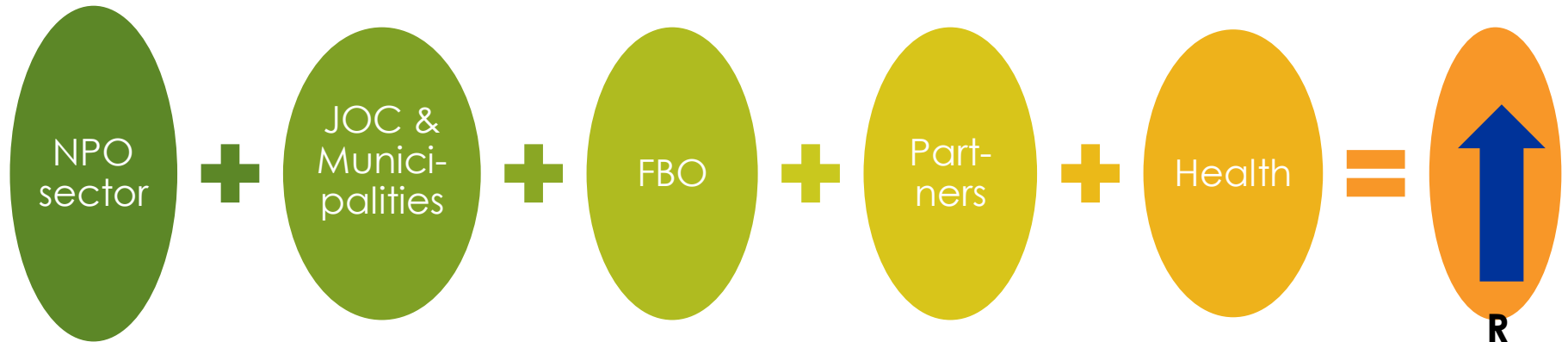

Local Authority and JOC's

Self-registration

NPO

- Used Cell phones to help register public
- Home to home with integrated screening was done
- Allocation of CHW to support alternative registration sites
- If safety was a problem to carry cell phones – complete paper-based form and NPO offices, do it electronically
- Helped at CDU sites with registration
- Used their own offices as sites
- Outreach to Shopping malls /clinics/community halls



Self-registration

Partners



- Thusong centres as hotspot and the staff helping those having difficulty to self-register
- Individual visits to various institutions/partners/retail/business to support self-registration
- Recommending and referring public use of free Wi-Fi hotspots (at schools / libraries /health/other departments)
- Linking up with farm communities, large Farm Companies, Pakstore, farmer associations



- Early initiating support for self-registration
- Setting up self-registration sites at clinics and central points in town , with support to the NPO sector
- Using “non-vaccination days” in smaller towns to do registration campaigns
- Chronic Disease Groups – registration done when home deliveries were done or they collect their meds



- Staff helping if some-one in need ask at work
- Admin clerks at reception/registration offer help with each contact with a person. Standard question: Do you need support to register for vaccination?
- Use EVDS registration report to target registration interventions
